SUMMARY—Prohibits the sale or transfer of ivory under certain circumstances. (BDR 52-1022)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets {omitted material} is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to trade practices; prohibiting the sale or transfer of ivory and ivory products under certain circumstances; setting forth certain exceptions; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Section 5 of this bill prohibits the sale or transfer of ivory and ivory products in 1 23456789 this State. Section 6 of this bill provides certain exemptions from the prohibition on the sale or transfer of ivory and ivory products if: (1) the ivory or ivory product is an antique and makes up less than 20 percent of the antique and the owner or seller provides certain historical documentation; (2) the sale or transfer is for an educational or scientific purpose; (3) the ivory or ivory product is being distributed to a beneficiary or heir of a trust or estate, or the transfer or sale is between multiple beneficiaries or heirs of a trust or estate for the purpose of dividing the assets of the trust or estate; or (4) the ivory or ivory product is a musical instrument, or part of a 10 musical instrument, manufactured before December 31, 1975. Section 7 of this bill 11 provides that a person who violates the provisions of this bill is guilty of a gross 12 misdemeanor for the first offense, a category E felony for the second offense and a 13 category D felony for the third or subsequent offense.





THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 597 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 7, inclusive, of this 3 act.

4 Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 7, inclusive, of this act, unless 5 the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3 and 4 of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in 6 7 those sections.

Sec. 3. "Ivory" means a hard white substance that is a 8 9 variety of dentin which composes the main part of the teeth or tusks of certain animals, including, without limitation, elephants, 10 hippopotamuses, mammoths, narwhals, walruses and whales. 11

Sec. 4. "Ivory product" means any item that is manufactured 12 and contains worked or raw ivory or that is made, in whole or in 13 14 part, from ivory.

Sec. 5. Except as otherwise provided in section 6 of this act, a 15 person shall not sell or offer for sale, lease, purchase, trade, 16 barter, place in the stream of commerce or otherwise distribute or 17 transfer possession of ivory or an ivory product in this State. 18

19 Sec. 6. 1. A person may sell or offer for sale, lease, purchase, trade, barter, place in the stream of commerce or 20 otherwise distribute or transfer the possession of ivory or an ivory 21 22 product in this State if: 23

(a) The ivory or ivory product is an antique and:

(1) The ivory or ivory product within the antique makes up 24 less than 20 percent by volume of the antique; and 25

(2) The antique status of the ivory or ivory product is 26 established by the owner or seller thereof with historical 27 documentation evidencing provenance and demonstrating that the 28 29 antique is at least 100 years old at the time of the sale or transfer 30 of possession:

31 (b) The sale, offer for sale, lease, purchase, trade, barter, placement in the stream of commerce or other distribution or 32 transfer of possession of the ivory or ivory product is for a bona 33 fide educational or scientific purpose, including, without 34 limitation, historical research or display in a public museum; 35

(c) The distribution or transfer of possession of the ivory or 36 ivory product is to a legal beneficiary of a trust or heir of an 37 estate, or a sale, offer for sale, lease, purchase, trade, barter or 38 other distribution or transfer of possession of ivory or an ivory 39 product is engaged in between multiple beneficiaries of a trust or 40 heirs of an estate for the purpose of dividing the assets of the trust 41 42 or estate: or





1 (d) The ivory or ivory product is a musical instrument, or part 2 of a musical instrument, including, without limitation, string and 3 wind instruments and pianos, and the owner or seller thereof 4 provides historical documentation evidencing provenance and 5 demonstrating that the musical instrument was manufactured not 6 later than December 31, 1975.

7 2. As used in this section, "antique" means a unique object of 8 personal property that has special value primarily because of its 9 age.

10 Sec. 7. Any person who violates any provision of sections 2 to 11 7, inclusive, of this act:

12 1. For the first offense, is guilty of a gross misdemeanor;

13 2. For the second offense, is guilty of a category E felony and 14 shall be punished as provided in NRS 193.130; and

15 3. For the third and any subsequent offense, is guilty of a 16 category D felony and shall be punished as provided in 17 NRS 193.130.
